In Connecticut, our state constitution guarantees that crime victims and their families are entitled to:

- ◆ Be treated with fairness and respect throughout the criminal justice process;
- ◆ Receive Financial Restitution;
- ◆ Timely disposition of the case following arrest of the accused
- ◆ Be reasonably protected from the accused throughout the criminal justice process;
- ◆ Receive notification of court proceedings;
- ◆ Attend the trial and all court proceedings;
- ◆ Communicate with the prosecution about the case;
- ◆ Object to or support any plea agreement entered into by the accused and prosecution;
- ◆ Make a statement to the court at sentencing;
- ◆ Information about the arrest, conviction, sentence, imprisonment and release of the accused.
