DIRECTORS REPORT:

1. We had a problem with the air conditioner in the Dial-A-Ride bus. This has been corrected.
2. **Volunteer Thanksgiving** – Party was on May 31, 2017 at Nuchies Restaurant and was attended by 175 volunteers. All participants enjoyed great food, wonderful music, and dancing.
3. **Caregivers – Changing Brain** – The program was held on June 7 at the Plainville Library with 34 people in attendance. Dinner was served and much information was provided.
4. **Mental Health 101** – UPDATE – The program was held on June 1 at the Plainville Library with 35 people in attendance of different age groups. Dinner was served and lots of important information was given out.
5. **Municipal Aging Grant** – Format has changed to make it less time consuming to prepare this grant. The grant is for \$18,312.00. The grant covers quick trips, social day care, shopping trips and is open to the disabled as well as seniors. The Senior Center provides funds to PARC for transportation for social activities and camp. We are waiting to see if the grant is approved.


NEW BUSINESS: NONE
