## PROCEDURE TO OBTAIN A TEMPORARY STATE PISTOL PERMIT

- 1.) Fill out the application completely and carefully.
- 2.) Sign/Date the following (2) forms: 1) FBI Privacy Act Statement

2) Noncriminal Justice Applicant's Privacy Rights

- 3.) Complete the **CT Criminal History Records Search (CCHRS)** PreEnrollment form online. Go to the website: <u>https://ct.flexcheck.us.idemia.io/CCHRSPreEnroll</u>
  - a. Enter Service Code: 89B5-2A69 (This code is ONLY for Plainville applicants.)
  - b. Agency: Plainville PD, Applicant Type: Pistol Permit (select "Yes" to begin)
  - c. Enter your contact and demographic information (all mandatory fields are highlighted in blue with an asterisk (\*)). \*\*\*please accurately enter as much information as possible, including the non-mandatory green fields (where applicable)\*\*\*
  - d. Once reviewed/completed, click Submit.
  - e. You will then be directed to complete an **on-line payment of \$88.25 plus 3%** service fee (this payment must be made via credit/debit card). This payment includes the state (\$75.00) and federal (\$13.25) background check fees.
  - f. Confirmation screen should state, "SUCCESS. Your Pre-Enrollment has been submitted" and provide an "Applicant Tracking Number". Click <u>PRINT</u> on the top right of the screen (retain this printed document as it is required at the time your fingerprints are taken). \*\*\*You should receive a copy of this document via e-mail\*\*\*
  - g. Select "I am Done, end this session" or "Start a new request" (if applicable)
- 4.) When steps 1-3 are completed, you **must** personally bring to the Plainville Police Department the following:
  - a. The completed application (the last page must be notarized and stamped).
  - **b.** The FBI Privacy Act Statement and the Noncriminal Justice Applicant's Privacy Rights form (both signed/dated)
  - c. CCHRS PreEnrollment document with Applicant Tracking number
  - d. Your driver's license (a copy will be made and your license will be returned).
  - e. Your birth certificate (original or certified copy: we will return the original).
  - f. Immigration & Naturalization document(s) if applicable (original or certified copy).
  - **g.** A copy of the certificate showing successful participation in an authorized handgun safety/training course within the past (2) years.
  - h. Your Passport (optional) (a copy will be made and your Passport will be returned)
  - i. Submit a money order (no personal checks/no cash) in the amount of <u>\$70.00</u> made out to the "<u>Town of Plainville</u>" (fee for the local issuing authority). \*\*\*remember to sign the money order\*\*\*

5.) Upon submitting your application, related documents, and money order at the police department, you will be fingerprinted. The fingerprints will be submitted electronically to the CT State Police and FBI.

You will be contacted by mail within **8-10 weeks** after the state mandated background investigation concludes. If approved, the Plainville Police Department will issue you a temporary state pistol permit, which is valid for 60 days. *After receiving your temporary state pistol permit, you have 60 days in which to apply to the Connecticut Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection (CT DESPP) for a regular state pistol permit. The fee to the CT DESPP is \$70.00 and any check or money order must be made out to "Treasurer, State of CT." #### Renewals for Armed Security Officers (Blue Cards/Class 1) and Bail Enforcement Agents (Gold Cards/Class2)

- Follow the instructions above for Pistol Permits Renewal In-Person. 1.
- 2. An additional check or money order for \$62.00 is required, made payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut,"
- 3. Include a self-addressed, stamped #10 envelope.
- Armed Security Officers must submit a DPS-1030-C annually as proof of completion of the handgun qualification refresher course. 4.

#### Eligibility Certificates (New & Renewals)

- New applicants must complete the DPS-799-C and DPS-164-C, and sign it in the presence of an official when your photo is taken. 1.
- Submit an affidavit signed by an instructor certified by the State, the National Rifle Association, or the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection 2. stating that the applicant successfully completed a safety or training course in the use of pistols or revolvers or long guns. Such statement shall specify that the instructor was so certified at the time that he taught the course, and shall include the full name of the applicant, and the date, location and duration of the course
- Submit fingerprints with two (2) separate checks or money orders to cover the federal processing fee of \$13.25 and the state fee of \$75.00, both made 3. payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut", for the required criminal background checks.
- Submit an additional check or money order for \$35.00 made payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut" for the processing of the Eligibility Certificate. If you 4. are appearing in person, exact cash payments will be accepted.
- When applicable, criminal and/or mental health records must be submitted per Connecticut General Statutes Section 29-36g. 5.
- Renewal applicants must submit a DPS-129-C-2, with \$35.00 fee made payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut" and documentation of legal and lawful 6.
- presence in the United States (see # 2 under "Pistol Permits New" for acceptable documents), if previously not verified. Do not mail cash.
- 7. Include a self-addressed, stamped #10 envelope.

#### Ammunition Certificates (New & Renewals):

- New applicants must complete DESPP-417-C, and sign it in the presence of an official when your photo is taken. 1.
- Submit check or money order for \$35.00 made payable to "Treasurer, State of Connecticut" or exact cash payment, for the processing of the 2. Ammunition Certificate.
- 3. When applicable, criminal and/or mental health records must be submitted per Connecticut General Statutes Section 29-36g
- Renewal applicants must submit a DPS-129-C-2 with \$35.00 fee made payable to "Treasurer State of Connecticut." Do not mail cash. 4.

NOTICE

Pursuant to C.G.S. §§ 29-28, 29-32, 29-36f 29-36l, and 18 U.S.C. § 922, applications covered by these instructions will not be issued or be renewed, if:

- 1. You have a FELONY CONVICTION in any jurisdiction.
- 2. You have a MISDEMEANOR CONVICTION in Connecticut for one of the following crimes: After 10/01/1994
  - a. Illegal possession of controlled or hallucinogenic substances, as specified under C.G.S. § 21a-279
  - b. Criminally negligent homicide as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-58
  - c. Assault in the third degree as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-61
  - d. Assault of an elderly, blind, disabled or pregnant person or a person with intellectual disability in the third degree as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-61a

  - Reckless endangerment in the first degree as specified under C.G.S. § 53a-63

## FBI Privacy Act Statement

Authority: The FBI's acquisition, preservation, and exchange of fingerprints and associated information is generally authorized under 28 U.S.C. 534. ## Noncriminal Justice Applicant's Privacy Rights

As an applicant who is the subject of a national fingerprint-based criminal history record check for a noncriminal justice purpose (such as an application for employment or a license, an immigration or naturalization matter, security clearance, or adoption), you have certain rights which are discussed below. All notices must be provided to you in writing. <sup>1</sup> These obligations are pursuant to the Privacy Act of 1974, Title 5, United States Code (U.S.C.) Section 552a, and Title 28 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), 50.12, among other authorities.

• You must be provided an adequate written FBI Privacy Act Statement (dated 2013 or later), by the agency that will receive your criminal history results, when you submit your fingerprints and associated personal information. This Privacy Act Statement must explain the authority for collecting your fingerprints and associated information and whether your fingerprints and associated information will be searched, shared, or retained.<sup>2</sup>

• You must be advised in writing of the procedures for obtaining a change, correction, or update of your FBI criminal history record as set forth at 28 CFR 16.34.

• You must be provided the opportunity to complete or challenge the accuracy of the information in your FBI criminal history record (if you have such a record).

• If you have a criminal history record, you should be afforded a reasonable amount of time to correct or complete the record (or decline to do so) before the officials deny you the employment, license, or other benefit based on information in the FBI criminal history record.

• If agency policy permits, the officials may provide you with a copy of your FBI criminal history record for review and possible challenge. If agency policy does not permit it to provide you a copy of the record, you may obtain a copy of the record by submitting fingerprints and a fee to the FBI. The FBI will then forward your challenge to the agency that contributed the questioned information and request the agency to verify or correct the challenged entry. Upon receipt of an official communication from that agency, the FBI will make any necessary changes/corrections to your record in accordance with the information supplied by that agency. • You have the right to expect that officials receiving the results of the criminal history record check will use it only for authorized purposes and will not retain or disseminate it in violation of federal statute, regulation or executive order, or rule, procedure or standard established by the National Crime Prevention and Privacy Compact Council.<sup>3</sup>
