III. Financial / Budget Report

A. 2016 – 2017 Budgets – Directed by Town Manager be extremely conservative with Fiscal Year 2017 budget. I included in your packet our 3 recreation budgets that show line items in 510 and 515 budget that were approved in 2016 and requested in 2017. The full time salary line items were directed to be increased by 2.5%. 510 full time salaries 2.5 percent 3347 include Director Salary, 70% of Assistant Director Salary and 50% of Administrative Assistant. Other increases are \$800 for contractual services outdoor entertainment. All other line items in 515 budget remain the same total increase requested \$4147.

515 - 2.5% full time salary of 30% Assistant Director \$340.00, part time salaries, minimum wage increase 45 cents increase \$5050 with \$1550 Day Camp. \$3500 Berner Pool, lifeguard overtime at \$350 – last number \$1900 short. Already spent \$1728 without June expenditure. Increase operating supplies \$700. Additional staff shirts. Meeting on Summer Staff. Up 2 per staff. Day Camp and Lifeguards to wear staff shirts daily not just 1st day of program. Total increase of 515 budget \$6440.

Recreation Fund – Balance July 1 \$83,856, fee revenue 2015 \$120,131. Berner Pool Fund balance July 1 \$159,002. Active pool budget \$66,905. Did not request additional \$10,000 /year.

Capital Paderewski Park – Balance \$13,622. This year budget \$56,000, Field #4 Norton and new outfield fence, lights, light fixtures. Request this year \$40,825. Paderewski Park Fire engine and shaded seating area.
