The Transfer Station on Granger Lane season. The hours of operation are 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on Saturday's only. Plainville residents must show identification. There is a fee for disposal which can be found on the Town's website

The 2019 Spring Bulk collection will take place Mondays now through June 24th. Please note there will be no collections Monday, April 22 or May 27. Residents who currently have curbside rubbish and recycling collection from the Town of Plainville can request one bulk pickup per calendar year free of charge for large items that do not fit in normal rubbish collection. **Eligible property owners must call CWPM at (860)793-6721 to schedule a pickup**. When calling, you will need to provide your name, address, phone number, and a complete description of the items to be collected. Calls placed by 3:00pm Friday can be scheduled for collection on Monday. Bulk items should be placed curbside no more than 24 hours before your scheduled pickup. Bulk items must not block or create a safety concern for sidewalks or driveways.
