Here's what you need to know today, May 20th:

- Today, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) approved Connecticut's
 participation in a pilot program to provide online purchasing to SNAP Households.
 Last week, Senator Murphy joined a <u>letter</u> led by Senator Bob Casey calling
 on USDA to immediately work to ensure SNAP participants can receive home
 food delivery and curbside pickup during the COVID-19 pandemic. More

- Yesterday, Governor Lamont issued a new Executive Order on summer camps, allowing day camps to begin operations on June 22, summer school programs to begin operations on July 6, and resident camps to remain closed.
- Connecticut's insurance commissioner is reminding all insureds in the state that all out-of-pocket costs for testing and treatment of COVID-19 have been removed.

- Earlier this week, Senator Murphy <u>announced</u> bipartisan support for <u>legislation</u> he
 introduced last year with Senator Jeanne Shaheen of New Hampshire to require
 the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to increase the amount of
 personal protective equipment (PPE) it procures from American companies.
- The Federal Communications Commission <u>announced</u> another round of telehealth enhancement grants, including awards for Bridgeport Hospital, Lawrence Memorial Hospital, Greenwich Hospital, and Yale New Haven Hospital.
- Earlier today, Senator Murphy joined Brian Lehrer on the Brian Lehrer Show to talk about Connecticut's partial reopening and efforts he's taking in Washington to bring relief to workers, families and small businesses in Connecticut. You can listen to the interview here.
- ICYMI: This week, the USDA <u>announced</u> final details in how it will make the direct payments to farmers authorized in the CARES Act.
