

### Friends of the Library Monthly Meetings

Friends meetings are open to all members and anyone interested in joining. Meetings are held on the last Saturday of the month at 9:00 AM from September through May in the Conference Room at the Plainville Public Library.

### **Discounted/Free Passes**

Available to adult library cardholders from any town. Reservations can be made online. Print-from-home passes may be printed or shown on a device at the venue. Passes are only valid for the date of the reservation.

### General Information

- Loan Periods 21 days for most materials, except seven days for entertainment DVDs and magazines. Two weeks for loanable technology.
- Holds Items not readily available for checkout may be placed on hold. Patrons can choose to be notified via email, phone call, or text when materials are available for pickup. Holds will be forfeited if items are not picked up within five business days of notification.
- Fines Anything checked out at the Plainville Public Library is fine-free except for returnable museum passes (\$5.00/day), Mobile Hotspots (\$5.00/day), Chromebooks (\$10.00/day), Nintendo Switch (\$10.00/day) and Nintendo Switch games (\$1.00/day). Materials that are never returned, or returned in a damaged condition, will be charged the replacement cost of the item(s).
- Renewals Eligible items are automatically renewed up to two times.
- Copy Black & white copies are \$0.10/page and \$0.25/page for color.
- Fax Faxes are \$1.00/page. Faxes of five pages or more are \$5.00.
- Scan Scanning to a flash drive or email address is free.
- Computers The Microsoft Office Suite and internet access are available on all public computers.
- Printing Black & white printing is \$0.10/page and \$0.25/page for color.
- Wi-Fi The Wi-Fi network is **PPL** and the password is **Plainville**.

# Passport to Libraries: April 1st - 30th

The Connecticut Libraries Program, sponsored by the Connecticut Library Association, invites all Connecticut residents to visit as many of the participating Connecticut public libraries as possible during the month of April for the chance to win a prize.

Visit the Plainville Public Library to pick up a Passport and list of participating libraries beginning April 1st. A librarian will stamp the Passport and give each participant a gift to get started.
