Loan Periods	21 days for all materials, except seven days for entertainment DVDs and magazines.
Checkout Limits	Patrons may checkout up to five DVDs per library card.
Holds	Items not readily available for checkout may be placed on hold.
	Patrons can choose to be notified via email, phone call, or text when materials are available for pickup. Holds will be forfeited if items are not picked up within five business days of notification.
Fines	Anything checked out at the Plainville Public Library is fine-free except for returnable museum passes (\$5.00/day), Mobile Hotspots (\$5.00/day), and Chromebooks (\$10.00/day). Materials that are never returned, or returned in a damaged condition, will be charged the replacement cost of the item(s).
Renewals	Eligible items are automatically renewed up to two times.
Сору	Black & white copies are \$0.10/page and \$0.25/page for color.
Fax	Faxes are \$1.00/page. Faxes of five pages or more are \$5.00.
Scanning	Scanning to a flash drive or email address is free.
Computers	The Microsoft Office Suite and Internet access are available on all public computers.
Printing	Black & white printing is \$0.10/page and \$0.25/page for color.
Wi-Fi	The Wi-Fi network is PPL and the password is Plainville.
