### PLAINVILLE HISTORICAL SOCIETY - BLACK HISTORY MONTH PROGRAM

On February 28, 2024, at 7:00 PM, the Plainville Historical Society will present their Black History Month program featuring Plainville native Maurice Barboza who will be live via Zoom from the Washington D.C. area. This program will look at African American history from a national perspective but with local Plainville connections. Maurice will share the story about his Aunt Lena Santos Ferguson, who also grew up in Plainville, and her yearslong efforts to become a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution. He will also talk about his leadership of the National Mall Liberty Fund which is working to establish a memorial dedicated to African Americans who contributed to the American Revolution.
