## **SPRING BULK PICKUP**

## Spring Bulk Pickup is scheduled to start on Monday, April 8, 2024 and end on Monday, June 24, 2024.

Plainville has an on-demand policy for the collection of bulk pickup. Residents who currently have curbside waste and recycling collection are eligible to receive one bulk pickup per calendar year free of charge for acceptable large items that do not fit in normal waste collection.

### **TRANSFER STATION**

The Transfer Station on Granger Lane is set to open for the season on Saturday, April 6, 2024. The hours of operation will be on Saturdays, only, from 8am-3pm. The transfer station is for Town of Plainville residents, and an ID is required. No commercial vehicles or businesses are permitted to discard material.

There is a fee for the disposal of items. Please refer to the Town's website under "Transfer Station Ordinance" for fees and list of items accepted.
