Description of program: The original roofs, windows and their individual wood casings of the historic ca. 1850's Colt Brownstones, known respectively as Bldgs. #8 (the Foundry/Forge) and #10 (the Woodworking Shop) are badly deteriorated and in need of wholesale repair IAW USNPS guidelines to preserve their historic integrity, as well as their updated Energy Conservation efficiency for Public Access. To accomplish this task, we will retain the services of two (2) CT-based, respected architectural masonry preservation firms, i.e., the Jos. A. Gnazzo Co. ofUnion, CT, and Kroenenberger Co. of Middletown, CT, to provide these key services for the Congressionally approved, but as yet, unfunded, Coltsville National Park.
Need for program: The two (2) Portland, CT quarry-sourced, Colt Brownstones, built 1854-55, are the oldest surviving structures within the historic, 17-acre Colt Armory complex dating back to both Sam and his wife, Elizabeth, Colt. The adjacent famed 1864 "Blue Domed" East Armory, was itself built upon the original 1858 Armory after it was burned down by Southern sympathizers (1862) during the Civil War. As such, the Brownstones are unique historically and thus will serve as the principal PR/Visitor Center, Gift Shop and Cafe for the expected two (2) million tourists, educators, school, civic & Veterans groups coming to Hartford to see this one-of-a-kind view into this early Manufacturing and Frontier Westward element of the American Experience.
Neighborhood area to be served: Citizens, young and old, of the entire Litchfield and Farmington Valleys, the Greater Hartford Capitol Region, the entire State of CT and adjacent Northeast corridor. New England and East Coast States, principally, will be

served by this national educational tourism venue to be located in our Capitol City. National and interna-tional tourism appeal will also create additional tourism flow to Hartford and our State which currently rates at near last in the Union in per capita tourism generated income in spite of our illustrious, well-known Heritage and place in the American Experience. The Colt site is academically-recognized as the first mass production, interchangeable parts, manufacturing facility in the US, along with Plymouth's own Eli Terry's clock works!

Plan to implement the program:

Develop w/the principal management of both the Gnazzo and Kroenenberger firms an initial estimate to perform the extensive window replacement/refurbishment and rob restoration for both Brownstones, IAW US NPS standards for historical integrity, utilizing as much as possible the still existent windows, wood casings and rooting materials, consistent with visitor safety. Secure secondary cost estimates for the related extensive de-construction and re-building of the exterior Brownstone facades walls (from the Portland, CT, Quarry works) and decorative masonry, IAW applicable LEED and NPS standards. Finally, secure phased, multi-year funding on behalf of US NPS and our Colt Heritage Center from major US Philanthropic family sources.
