• FY2016 Audit Review by BlumShapiro

Nikoleta McTigue from BlumShapiro gave a summary of the FY16 Town Audit. Copies of the audit is available for review at the Town Clerk's office.

Water Test Update

Over the last two weeks, water samples have been collected from approximately 30 homes and businesses throughout Plainville. The samples were collected by Department of Public Health and Regional Health District staff.

It is expected that the analysis of the water samples will be completed in two to three weeks. A meeting with Town staff and Valley Water to review the test results will be held in mid-May. It is expected that representatives from DPH and PURA will attend this meeting as well.

A Public Information session is tentatively scheduled for **Thursday**, **June 8**th **at 7:00 pm** at a location to be determined. At this Public Information Session, Department of Health staff will present the water analysis results. The Department of Health officials will also present their recommendations and residents will have an opportunity to ask questions and comment as well.

All Day Vote

The All-Day Budget Vote will be held next Tuesday, April 25th in the Fire House meeting room. Under the Town Charter, residents will have the opportunity to vote separately on General

Government and Board of Education budgets. There will also be advisory questions for those residents who elect to vote no on either of the two questions.

• Public Hearing – School Renovations Project

A Public Hearing on the School Renovations Project will be held a week from today on April 24th at 7:00 pm in the Wheeler Elementary School Gymnasium. There will also be tours of Wheeler Elementary School beginning at 6:00 pm. Residents are encouraged to take a tour of the Wheeler School and to attend the Public Hearing.

A referendum on the appropriation to fund these improvements is anticipated to occur on Tuesday, June 6^{th} . That vote will also be held at the Fire House meeting room between the hours of 6:00 am to 8:00 pm.

• Dog Park Update

Town staff has been working with several members of the Dog Park Committee, including Chairman Dan Ciesielski, to do a field review of a dog park at the end of Norton Place Extension. Dan Ciesielski and Scott Adamson, members of the Committee both thought this could be a good location for the Dog Park. Chairman Ciesielski will be bringing this location back to the Dog Park Committee at their next meeting to be held on May 10. Dog owners are encouraged to come to the proposed site to give feedback to the Committee.

• Food Service Cart – Assignment of Lease Agreement

Since June of 2015, the Town has leased some town-owned land on White Oak Avenue near Tilcon to East Coast Hot Dogs. East Coast Hot Dogs has operated a food truck at that location for several years.

Town staff has been notified that East Coast Hot Dogs will be selling his business to Rick Martin who would like to continue with the same lease arrangements going forward. Mr. Martin intends to use the same name as the existing business.

<u>Lou Frangos, 10 Fairbanks St</u> comments included the progress of the Old Linden Street School Park.

Town Manager Lee stated the project is not 100% complete. Some of the steps the contractors are responsible for before turning the project over to the Town, are still being done. Sidewalks and decorative fencing will be installed after the school year has ended. The sundial will be shipped upon completion and mounted on the base once that has been installed. Activity will ramp up when school is out.

<u>Joanne Edman, 166 West Main St</u> comments included the recent rescue of a dog named George from Norton Park. She commended the Plainville Wind Ensemble for their benefit donations to Animal Control.
